Deborah Padgett, Ph.D.

New York University – Silver School of Social Work

Dr. Deborah Padgett has a doctoral degree in anthropology from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and post-doctoral training in public health and psychiatric epidemiology at Columbia University and Duke University, respectively. She is nationally known for her advocacy and practice of qualitative and mixed methods in research. She is the editor of *The Handbook of Ethnicity, Aging, and Mental Health* (1995) and *The Qualitative Research Experience* (2004), author of *Qualitative Methods in Social Work Research* (2008, 2nd ed.) and *Qualitative and Mixed Methods in Public Health* (2012), and co-author of *Program Evaluation* (5th ed., 2009). Dr. Padgett has published extensively on mental health needs and service use of homeless mentally ill adults, older women, ethnic groups, and children/adolescents. Dr. Padgett's international expertise in qualitative methods has led to invitations to speak at NIH-sponsored training institutes as well as to audiences in England, Germany, and India.

She received an unprecedented honor in 2006 when SSWR announced the Deborah K. Padgett Early Career Fellowship in recognition of her contributions. In 2012, she received the Distinguished Teaching Award from the Silver School.
