

UConn School of Social Work PhD Program
Rollin Williams/Y.C. Wu Fellowship

The School of Social Work PhD Program offers the Rollin Williams/Y.C. Wu Fellowship each year. The fellowship is intended to provide support to an incoming doctoral student who demonstrates the potential to make significant contributions to social work education, practice and/or scholarship.

All incoming doctoral students are eligible for the fellowship regardless of other financial supports. One award of \$10,000 per year for two years based on enrollment and good academic standing (for a total award of up to \$20,000) will be made to a student entering the PhD program in the 2019-20 academic year. Students may receive this award one time during their tenure in the PhD program and are encouraged to use the award as a general purpose/living stipend.

The PhD Program Director in consultation with the Doctoral Committee will select the fellowship recipient. The award is based on merit and is awarded based on review of the following materials submitted by applicants (as part of the regular application process):

- A current Curriculum Vita
- GRE Test scores
- Academic transcripts
- A personal statement
- A writing sample
- Professional references
